The Truro Township Trustees held a special meeting Thursday, June 25, 2026, at 9:00 am at Station 161. Present were Trustees Dennis Nicodemus, Toni Kleckley and Pat Mahaffey, Fiscal Officer Natalie Nicodemus, and Administrator Jason Nicodemus.

The Meeting was called to order with the pledge and roll call.

Dennis Nicodemus made a motion to pass:

Resolution 2026-19: Resolution requesting the Franklin County Auditor to certify the total current tax valuation of property within Truro Township, the amount to be generated from a renewal tax levy for current expenses within the Township, and additional information described in R.C. 5705.03(B).

Pat Mahaffey seconded.

Discussion: The proposed levy renewal will actually reduce the tax burden for property owners. While our current levy is 1.5 mills, this renewal would be reduced to 1.0 mill, providing an estimated savings of \$8 per year for every \$100,000 of property value, taking into consideration the current effective rates. If the levy does not pass, we would need to seek an additional levy in approximately three years. An additional levy rather than a renewal would cause an increase to taxpayers.
